Edna "Falls" Dulabahn homesteaded north of Guymon in 1907. She and her husband, Arthur Dulabahn, both realized the value of education and sacrificed during the depression and drought to send their children to school. All five of the Dulabahn girls received teaching degrees from PAMC. They all taught at least one year in Texas County and collectively taught for over 101 years.

Grace Hicks, Ida Mae Norman, and Gladys Steinkuehler established the Dulabahn Education Scholarship Fund in 1989. The fund has now grown to the extent that two scholarships are offered annually to graduates of Texas or Cimarron County high school, who are junior or seniors at Panhandle State University, majoring in elementary education or English education. Grace, Ida Mae, and Gladys were happy to have given scholarships in memory of their sisters, Gertrude and Ella, and their parents. They stated that the college has meant a great deal to the Dulabahn family through the years and the scholarships are a small way of showing their appreciation of what their family received from the university and living in the Oklahoma Panhandle.
