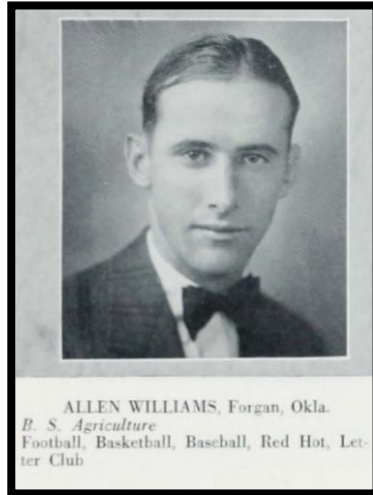

## Allen Williams Outstanding Ag Student Scholarship

Allen Williams was born on March 11, 1906, on a farm in southeastern Beaver County. During his elementary years, he attended a one-room school house at North Fork. So that he and his sister could attend high school, his parents moved to Forgan and bought a farm. During high school, Allen was very active in sports. Upon graduation in 1925, he entered PAMC. During his college years at PAMC, he was active in four sports, earning 16 letters. Allen graduated from PAMC with a degree in Agriculture on May 16, 1929, as president of his senior class. He was very active in Aggie sports earning 16 letters. Two hours after the graduation, Allen and Maxine Settles were married at her parent's home in Texhoma.

While at PAMC, Maxine was a charter member of the Red Hots; Basketball; Letter Club, Glee Club and Blue Curtain. She was also the 1929 Athletic Queen and a cheerleader. Maxine Williams graduated from PAMC in 1930 earning the first Chemistry degree from PAMC.

Allen and Maxine both served terms for the Alumni Association. Allen served terms as president and vice-president. Maxine served as secretary.

Allen Williams worked with the USDA Farmers Home Administration, retiring after 35 years. Both his daughter, Nornell, and son, Joe, graduated from PAMC.
